Q4: Should I reflect my Chinese collaborators who are jointly funded by the JI award in the Foreign Collaborations/Components section?

A4: JI-funded UM faculty should only reflect their Chinese collaborators in the Foreign Collaborations/Components section if the Chinese collaborators are performing outside of the U.S. a significant element of the work being proposed to or funded by NIH, irrespective of whether there is a subaward to the Chinese collaborators.
